HISTORY OF VICTORY BAPTIST COLLEGE

Victory Baptist College was established in 1987 by our college president, Dr. Samuel E. Hyde, Sr., and then Dean, Mr. Earl Hodges, in Hampton, Virginia, its' present home. The college and Seminary is a local church ministry under the auspices of Victory Baptist Church along with the Victory Baptist School.

OUR PRESIDENT

DR. SAMUEL ELMER HYDE, SR. graduated from Clear Creek Baptist College, Pineville, Kentucky in May 1963. During his time in college he was pastor of Riverview Baptist Church in Calvin, Kentucky.

He returned to Hampton, Virginia (where he lived prior to college) and started Victory Baptist Church, with his and three other families, in October 1963. He worked as a construction superintendent for two years until the church was large enough to support him full time. His wife, Shirley, has played a vital role in all of the ministries up to this point and those that have followed over the years.

The Central Baptist College of Hampton, Virginia extended an invitation to Pastor Hyde to teach in their institution. Which he did from September 1966 until January 1986.

Victory Baptist Children's Home was founded in 1978 as a church ministry with Pastor Hyde as its director for the next eleven years. With the children's home there was a need for a school. The children attended Central Baptist School for two years and in 1980 Victory Baptist School was started. Since additional

training was required, Pastor Hyde attended school in Lewisville, Texas. After completing this, he has served as principal until the present.

Other studies include twenty-five hours of study in constitutional law at Bob Jones University, Greenville, South Carolina. Study and preparation has a definite goal in Pastor Hyde's life. Since 1981 he has attended two annual seminars in order to improve his abilities to serve the Lord. He continues to attend seminars.

With the expertise of Earl F. Hodges, Pastor Hyde led the Victory Baptist Church in establishing Victory Baptist Bible College. He has served as its president since its' founding in 1987.

In May 1994 Tabernacle Baptist College and Theological Seminary, Virginia Beach, Virginia conferred a doctor of divinity degree upon him.

The Virginia Assembly of Independent Baptist elected Pastor Hyde to serve a three-year term on the board of directors. This assembly includes five hundred churches across Virginia.

Dr. Hyde a native of Bryson City, North Carolina and veteran the Korea war is a frequent speaker in alumni meetings, revival meetings, and pastor's fellowship meetings.

OUR DEAN OF STUDENTS

DR. THOMAS W. GILES, SR. Our present dean came on board September 1998. He taught in the college for 10 years prior to his appointment as the Dean of Students. He is a graduate of Central Baptist College in Hampton, VA; Victory Baptist College in Hampton, VA; Bethany Bible College and Seminary in Dothan, AL; And Andersonville Baptist Bible College and Seminary in Camilla, GA. Dr. Giles pastored for over twenty years. Dr. Giles is a native of Danville, VA, and a retired Army Warrant Officer. Dr. Giles and his wife, Dr. Sharon Giles, serve in the teaching ministry together. Dr. Giles holds a Bachelor of Bible, a Bachelor of Ministry, a Master of Bible, a Master of Ministry, a Doctor of Religious Education, a Doctor of Theology, and a Doctor of Ministry.

FORMER DEANS

MR. EARL F. HODGES, our first dean, served as dean from September 1987 to May 1993. He graduated from Baptist Bible College of Springfield Missouri in May 1967 with a Bachelor of Bible. He began serving as Dean of Central Baptist College of Hampton, Virginia in September of 1967. He held this position until May of 1978, when he resigned to take a pastorate in Branford, Florida. He served in this position until 1983 when he was called to teach at Baptist University of America in Atlanta, Georgia.

In 1987 he accepted call by Victory Baptist Church to return to Hampton, Virginia to aid in the founding of Victory Baptist Bible College. He became the first dean and served in this position for 5 years and 6 months. Because of declining health he resigned in May of 1993 and moved with his wife, Jean, to Texas near his son. He lived three months from that time and went home to be with his Savior.

After his graduation from Baptist Bible College he continued his studies to be the best teacher possible. He had such wisdom and knowledge that impressed many in the field of Christian Education.

DR. MILTON LEE GODFREY, III, our second dean, served as dean from July 1993 to September 1998 – 5 years and 2 months. Dr. Godfrey is a graduated of Atlantic Baptist College. He was in the pastorate many years at Faith Baptist Church in Emporia, Virginia. After leaving Faith Baptist Church he accepted the position as School Supervisor for Victory Baptist School and Dean of Victory Baptist College. He received his Master of Religious Education from Victory Baptist Seminary in May of 1994. He left the college in September 1998 to take a position with the Accelerated Christian Education Staff in Lewisville, Texas. Later he came back to finish his doctorial work with Victory Baptist Seminary, and graduated with a Doctor of Religious Education in January 10, 2002. At present Dr. Godfrey is the pastor of Fairview Baptist Church and principal of their school in Chesapeake, Virginia. His wife, Brenda Godfrey, serves with him in the school.

WELCOME TO VICTORY BAPTIST BIBLE COLLEGE & SEMINARY

ORIENTATION - On orientation night you will receive a registration form to be filled out and turn in on your first night of class. We prefer that you come by or

request in writing a copy of the registration form prior to the beginning of school and submit the \$30.00 registration fee. In any case registration fee MUST BE paid before you can take a class. There is an additional cost for books (s). Any exceptions will be cleared through the dean of students.

CLASSES - Classes begin at 6:30 PM. Student is required to arrive on time. If for any reason you will be late you must notify the college. For a three-hour class, there will be two 15-minute breaks; and for a two-hour class, there will be one 15-minute break. Each teacher can elect not to take a break and complete class in an early fashion.

CHAPEL SERVICES - Chapel services will be held each month. The speaker and date for chapel will be (in most cases) posted in the Deans office.

REVIVALS - Revival services are considered a part of your semester requirement. You must attend the night (s) of your class. Each student is to make an outline of the revival message and turn it into the Dean of Students. This requirement will be a part of your learning experience.

BANQUET AND GRADUATION - At the end of the school year there is a college banquet. Each student is expected to attend.

DRESS CODE - Men are required to wear a tie and casual dress shirt and pants. Ladies are required to wear a dress or skirt and blouse. The dress or skirt must be below the knees and no low necklines. The dress may not have a split extending more than half way from the ankle to the knee.

SPECIAL OFFERINGS - Our teachers are not paid - they willingly give their time for you and the Lord. There will be a special offering each semester and each student is expected to participate. These offerings are used one hundred percent for the teachers love offering at the end of each semester. We are told in Scripture that the workman is worthy of his hire. Checks can be made out to Victory Baptist College and can be claimed on your tax return. At the beginning of the year you will receive a record of all you have given to the college.

ADMISSION POLICY

Undergraduate and graduate program of study are open to all who meet the admission requirements of Victory Baptist Bible College and Seminary provided

the candidate does not have some stand or life style contrary to our standard of written policy, laws, and By-laws. At the beginning of a new school year you need to decide the courses you will take based on those being offered. Registration for the first semester of the school year will be the last Monday in August at 6:00 p.m. If that is not a good time for those desiring to enroll, please call the college anytime before classes begin.

Classes will also begin on the last Monday in August at 6:30 p.m. All students will need to have completed registration and enrollment prior to starting class.

Registration and Tuition will be \$30 Registration and \$60 Tuition per student. We have intentionally kept the cost at a low level to help those who otherwise could not afford college.
